Tiverton High School inspires students to consider higher education


Tiverton High School has signed up to a new partnership with higher and further education providers, aiming to inspire young people to consider a pathway to higher education.

Next Steps South West is a consortium of universities and colleges from across the South West, who work together to gain funding from the Higher Education Funding Council for England (HEFCE), which will be used to inspire Year 9 to 13 students that may not have considered higher education for a range of reasons.

There are a number of wards and schools across Devon, Cornwall and Somerset that have typically low levels of uptake in higher education, and the funding will go towards raising awareness of higher education and increasing aspirations in students from these areas, through a programme of different schemes and events.

Although we promote many different types of pathways for when our students leave school, we would always want to see more of our students move into higher or further education. Working with Next Steps South West will help us to offer more information and support to students considering that pathway. It will also increase awareness to students across the board who initially wouldn't think about considering higher or further education as an option, despite clearly having the ability to achieve at the highest level.

The programme officially began in January, and includes higher and further education providers such as the University of Plymouth, University of Exeter, Cornwall College Group, Bridgwater & Taunton College and Petroc.

First Aid Procedures

We have had an increase in students calling home to say that they are unwell and need to go home. All students should be following the procedures as below:

During lessons:

Tell the teacher that you are feeling unwell and ask for a note to go to First Aid.

Students then go straight to First Aid where their details are recorded, an assessment made and then a decision as to whether parents/carers need to be informed. 95% of the time students return to lessons.

During break/lunch you do not need a note to attend First Aid.

If your child is unwell at the start of the day you should call the school on 01884 256655 and select the option to speak to Attendance. If you need to contact First Aid please dial the school and ask for extension 207.

If your child has a medical need (asthma, allergies, diabetes, etc) we may need to speak to you and fill out a Health Care Plan so that your child is fully supported in school.
