Exeter and District Athletics

On Thursday, nearly 100 students took part in the Exeter and District Athletics Trials, hoping to make it on to the Exeter Area team. The day started with the Hurdles final and instant success for THS as Cameron Bailey, in his first ever Hurdles race, stormed through the final two hurdles to claim first place. More early success came in the Year 7 Shot Put as Oliver Lewis out-threw his competitors to finish in first place.

An incredibly impressive performance came from Ella Woodman, who was competing against girls a year older, in the 300m sprint. Maintaining great form and pace throughout the whole race, Ella was able to storm clear in first place, claiming her place in the Exeter Area team.

Other great individual performance came from Emily Peters, who demonstrated great resilience to beat her opponents to win the 3000m, Charlie Cowlin who claimed second place in the Year 7 200m sprint and Jack Aldridge who ran clear in the 1500m, also racing against boys a year older.

In all, 13 students from THS qualified to represent the Exeter Area and they will compete at Exeter Arena on Thursday 17th May.

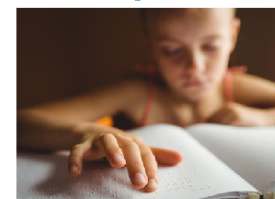
