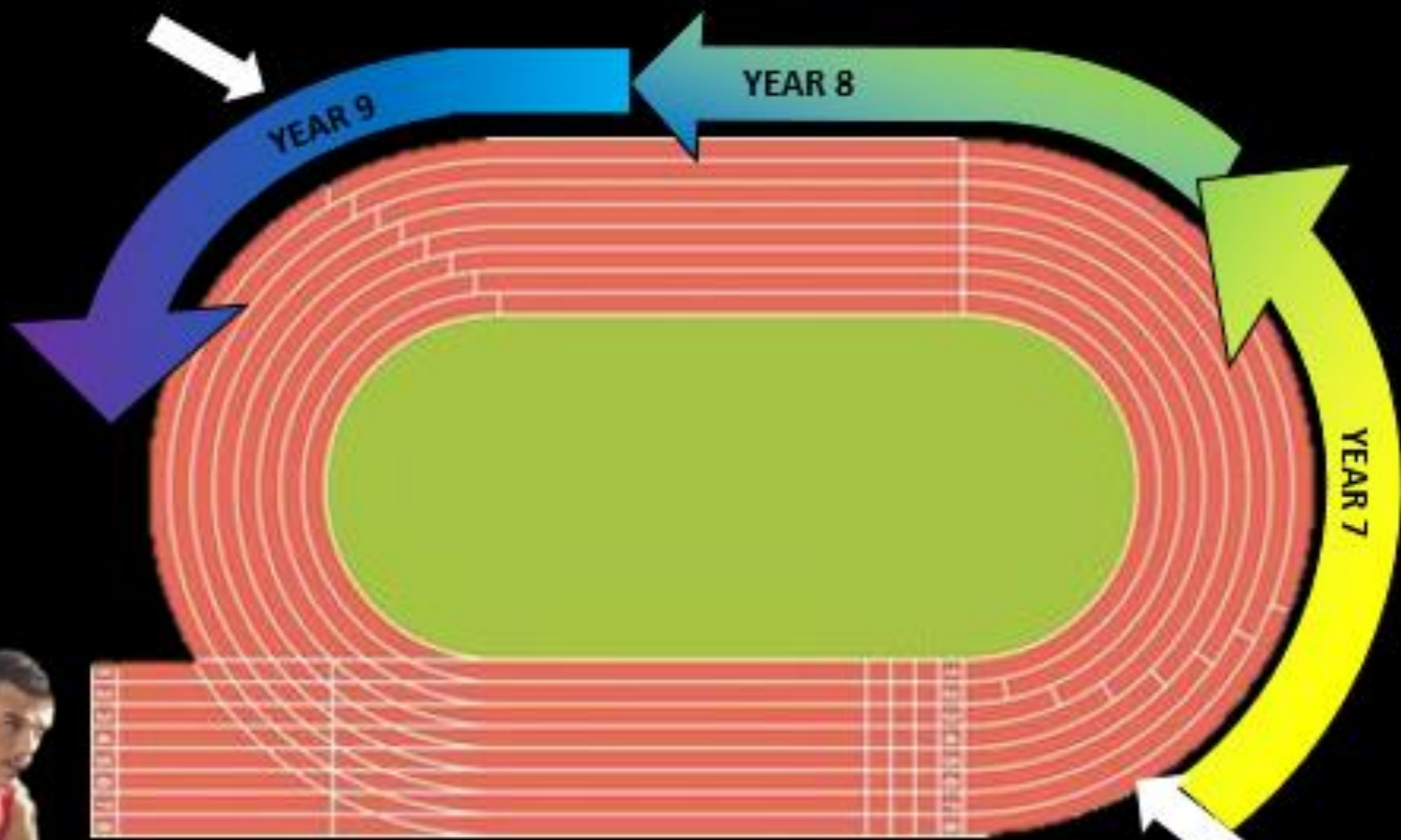

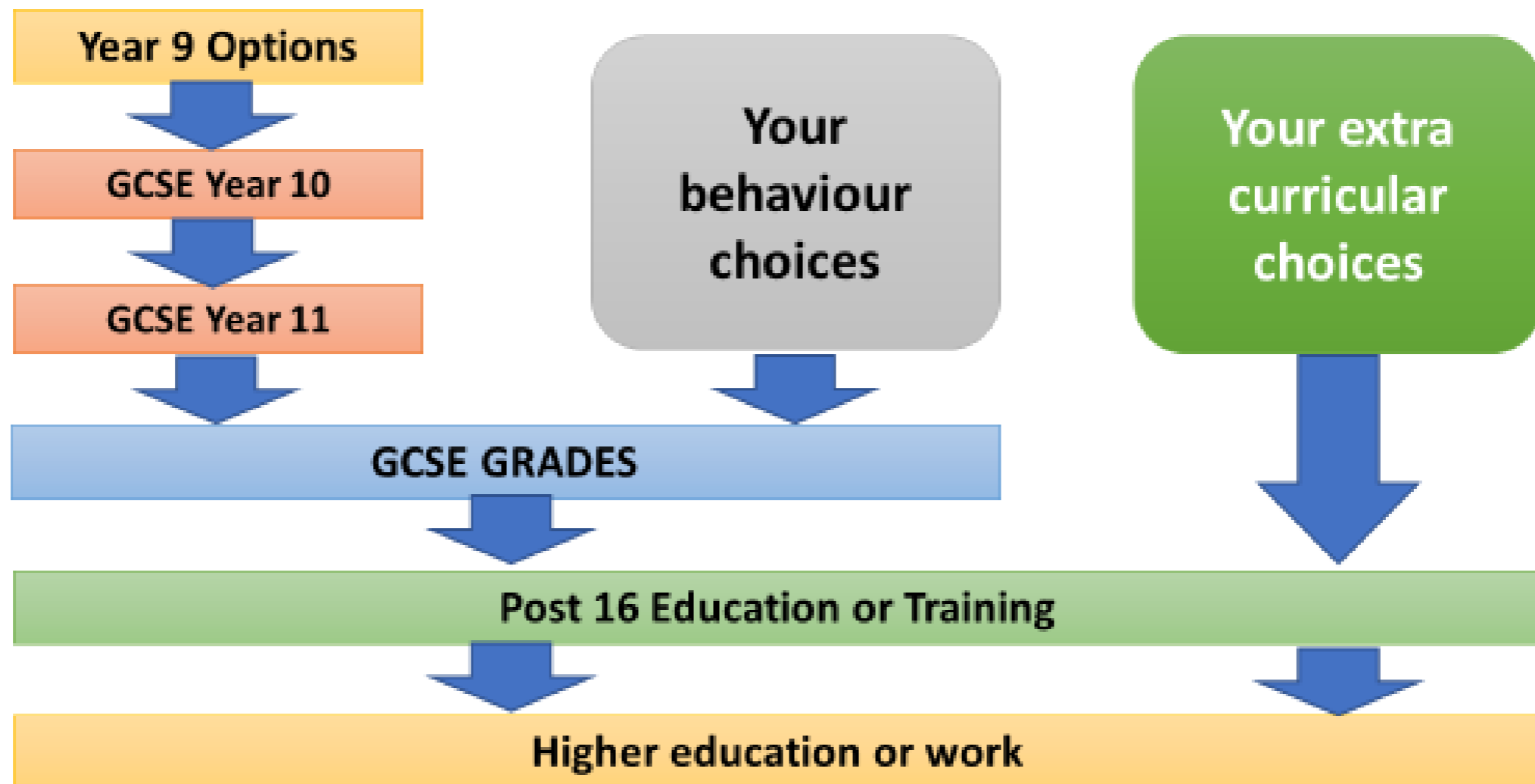

- RAG stands for Red, Amber and Green.
- **Green**- We think this is a good option for you to consider.
- **Amber**- We think this is an option worth considering however you will need to show more commitment to the subject to be successful
- **Red**- We have reservations about you taking this subject.
- If you do receive a 'Red' it does not mean that you will not do this option - but it is something that will be looked at seriously and discussed with you and your parents, and if other subjects are more positive then you will be directed towards those courses instead.

Will you have to **re-sit** if you do not achieve a grade 4 or above in maths and English?

What you choose now and what you attain in August 2026 could impact on your Level 3 choices.

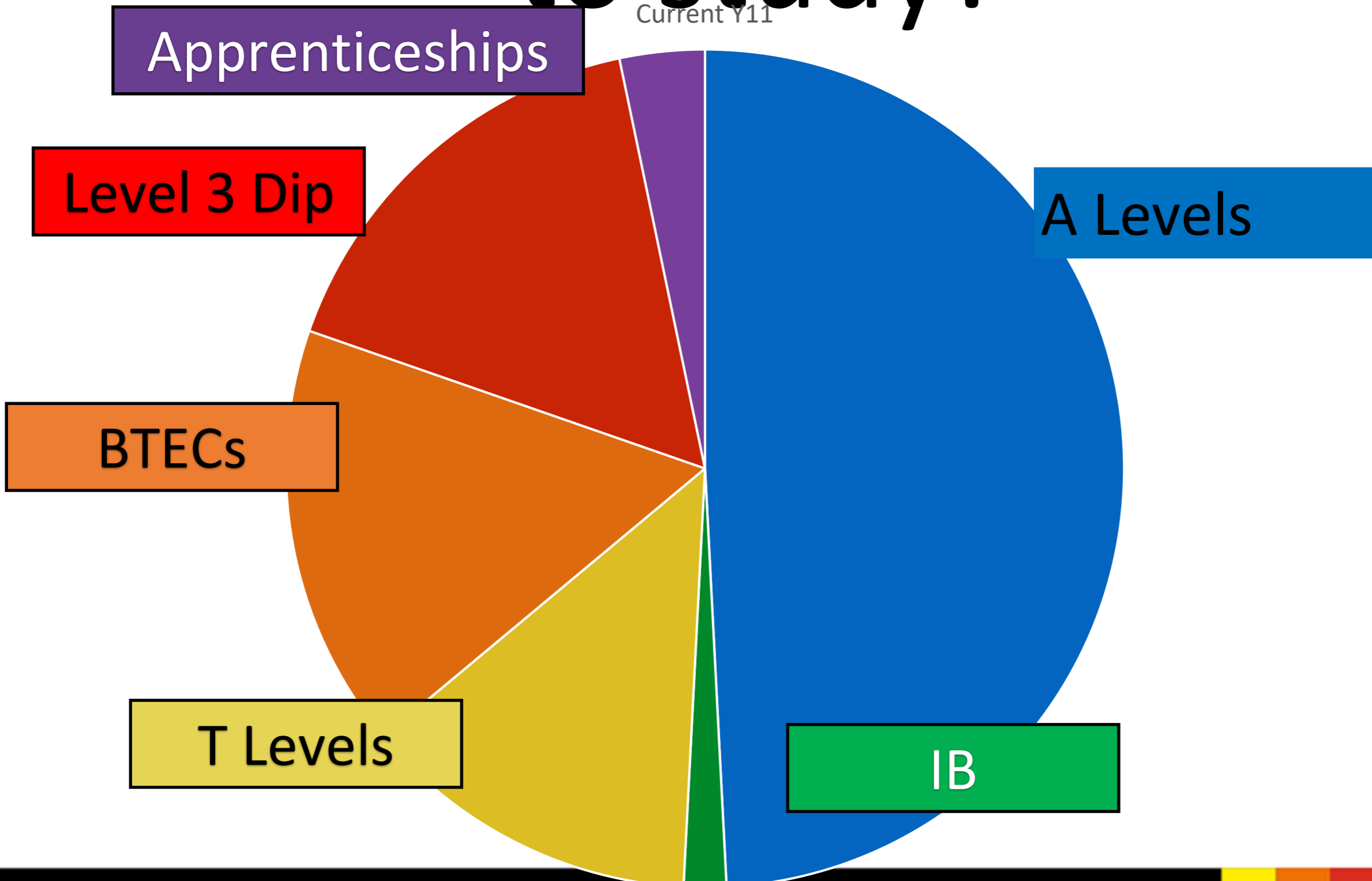

The Basics

- 8 subjects count in the progress 8 score (we do 9, the best 8 count)
- Basics in English and Maths: 'Good' pass is 5/5. 'Standard' pass is 4/4
- Need an EBacc subject
- Colleges are looking at target grades
- College places are competitive
- You need to be in education or training until you are 18



NSSW



A-Levels



Usually study at least three subjects

Exam assessment, coursework & sometimes a practical assessment

Most require at least five grade 4+ at GCSE, & often a grade 5 or 6 in the subjects you want to study

BTECs



Practical learning programmes that relate to specific job roles & sectors

They can help you get a job, progress in a career or go on to university

Designed by industry, courses range from Sport, IT, Forensic Investigation & engineering

T-Levels



Two year qualification equivalent to three A-levels

Leads to a specific industry

80% spent in the classroom 20% on job placement

Apprenticeships



You will have a contract of employment for at least 30 hours per week

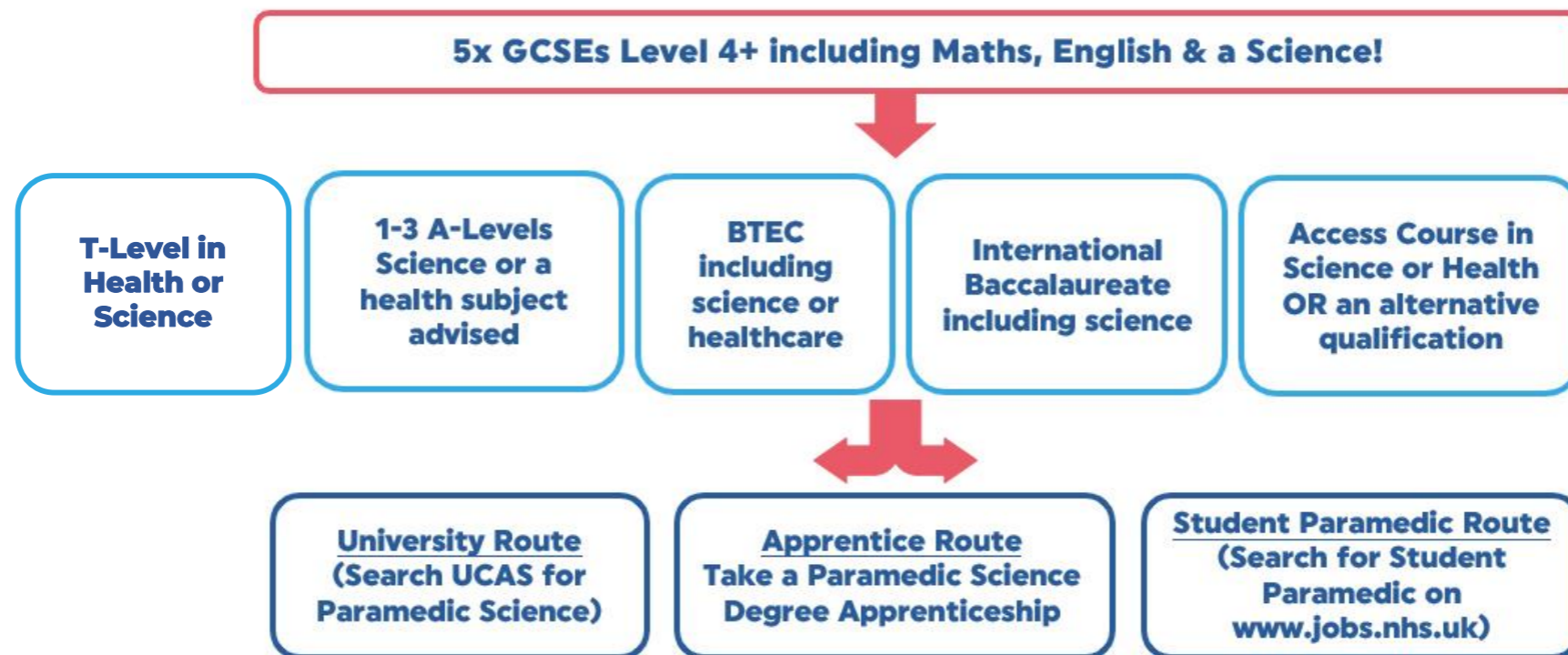
You earn a wage whilst gaining skills and qualifications

80% on the job training; 20% in the classroom

Minimum requirements are English & maths GCSE

Health and Social Care

About 3 million people work in health and social care. Health care roles include doctors, pharmacists, nurses, midwives and healthcare assistants, while social care roles include care assistants, occupational therapists, counsellors and administrators. Together, they account for nearly one in ten of all paid jobs in the UK.

ASSESSMENT:

Human Lifespan Development 30% Controlled assessment

Health and Social Care Services and Values 30% Controlled assessment

Health and wellbeing 40% Course Externally assessed.

OTHER INFORMATION: Demand for both health and social care is likely to rise, so they will continue to play a key role in UK society

This award prepares learners post 16 to enter A levels; a BTEC level 3 or a degree in aspects of health or social care.

H&SC Btec

gives learners the opportunity to develop sector-specific knowledge

- skills in a practical learning environment.
- Using data to assess an individual's health.
- designing a plan to improve their health and wellbeing.
- human growth and development
